INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

UBF seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation and income by investing in a mix of equities and fixed income securities. It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the composite return of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index and the HSBC Local Bond Index. 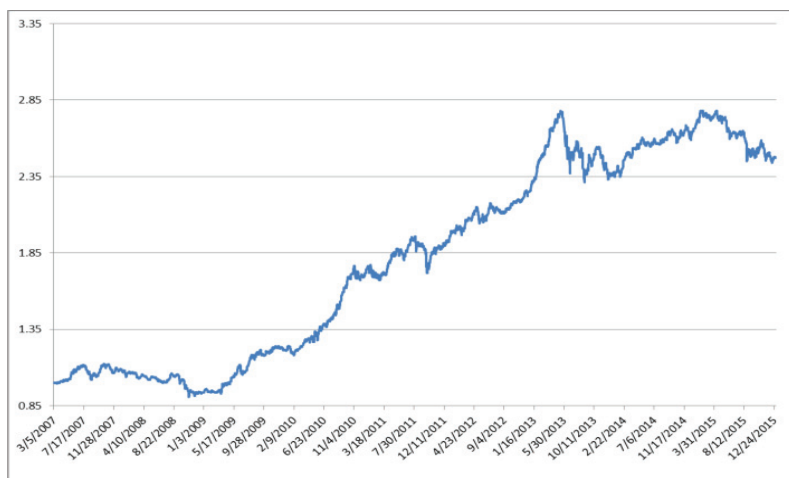

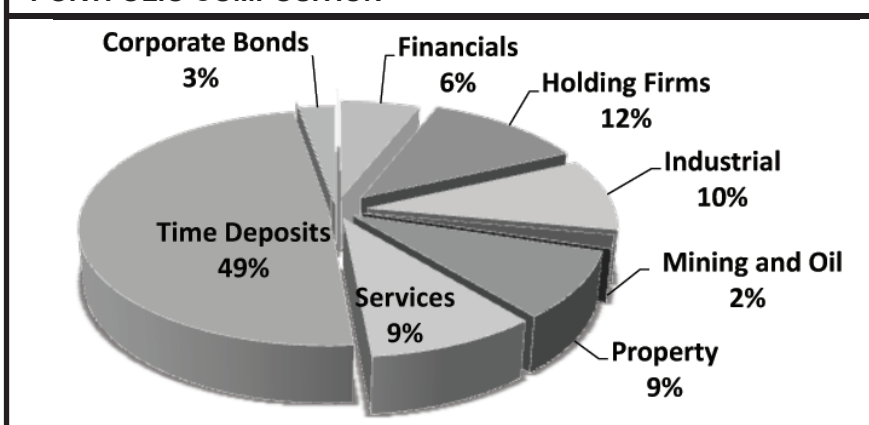
** Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to P7k which was approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The PSEi rose to an all-time high of 8,127 in April only to reverse direction a few months after on renewed concerns over Greece's debt, a slowdown in China and uncertainty arising from the looming Fed rate hike. These resulted to substantial outflows from emerging markets like the Philippines. On the local front, slower economic growth and uninspiring corporate earnings contributed to the lack of conviction amongst investors. The PSEi ended the year at 6,952 or 3.8% below the 2014 level.

The country's economy expanded by 6.0% in 3Q 2015 compared to the revised 5.8% growth in 2Q of this year. Govt. consumption and public investments were the key drivers for the quarter. November inflation came in at 1.1%, from a record low of 0.4% in Oct. on higher food prices. Inflation averaged 1.4% for 11M 2015. OFW remittances reached USD22.8 bn for the 1st 10 months or a 3.5% increase year-on-year.

During its last policy meeting for 2015, the Monetary Board of the BSP maintained its key rates at 4.0% for overnight borrowing, 6.0% overnight lending and 2.5% for the Special Deposit Account (SDA) rate. As expected, the US Federal Reserve finally raised its federal funds target rate to 0.25% - 0.5% from zero - 0.25% previously.

Financial markets continue to face strong headwinds from rising U.S. interest rates, strong US dollar, global slowdown and the May Presidential elections. These could create continued volatility and uncertainty in the near term.
