INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

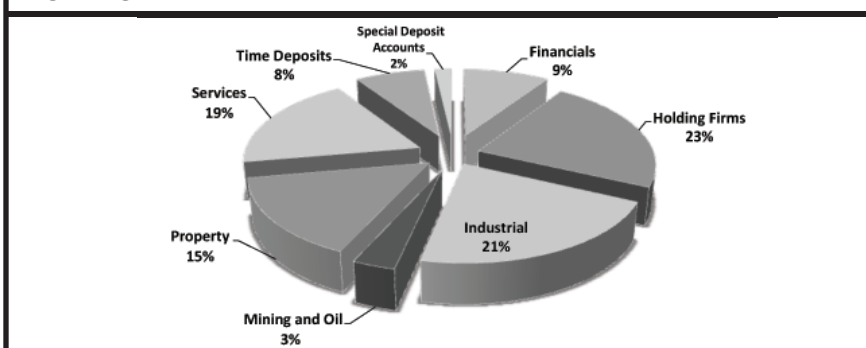
NAVPu Graph

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to P240k which was approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The move of China to devalue its currency surprised investors who were already nervous due to the looming rate hike by the Fed and the generally fragile global economic backdrop. The decision of the PBOC to devalue the RMB created much confusion amongst investors prompting them scramble for the exit. Markets around the world plunged massively as stocks were sold across the board. In the Philippines, the PSEi plummeted by 6.7%, its single day biggest drop since the 2008 global financial crisis. The index ended the month at 7,098. Nevertheless at this level, the PSE is still the least affected market in ASEAN as it only shed 1.8% YTD.

Meanwhile, the 2Q 2015 corporate earnings were generally uninspiring as most results were either in line or below analysts' expectations. On the average earnings grew by 8% to 11%. Not strong enough to mitigate negative investor sentiment.

The economy expanded by 5.6% in the 2nd quarter this year, slightly faster compared to the 5.0% growth achieved during the previous quarter. The 2Q growth was driven by domestic demand particularly household spending and construction.

We expect govt. spending to accelerate in the coming months. We believe that infrastructure spending will be the main vehicle for the government's pump priming activities.
