#### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

UBF seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation and income by investing in a mix of equities and fixed income securities. It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the composite return of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index and the HSBC Local Bond Index. 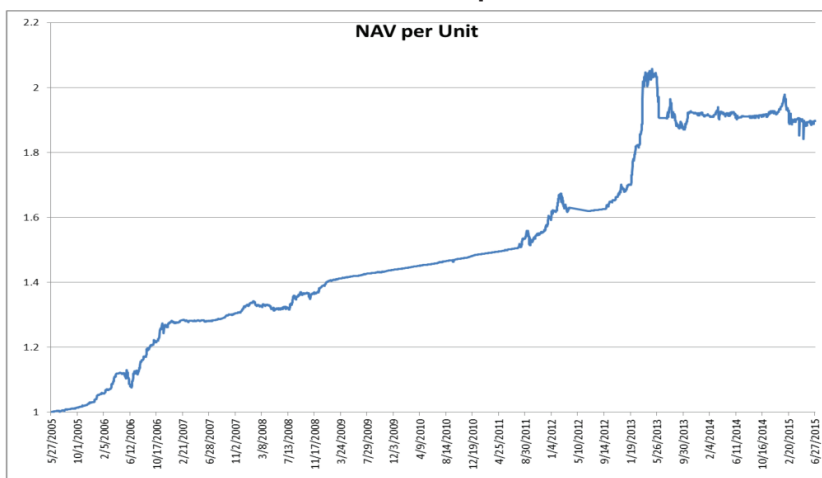

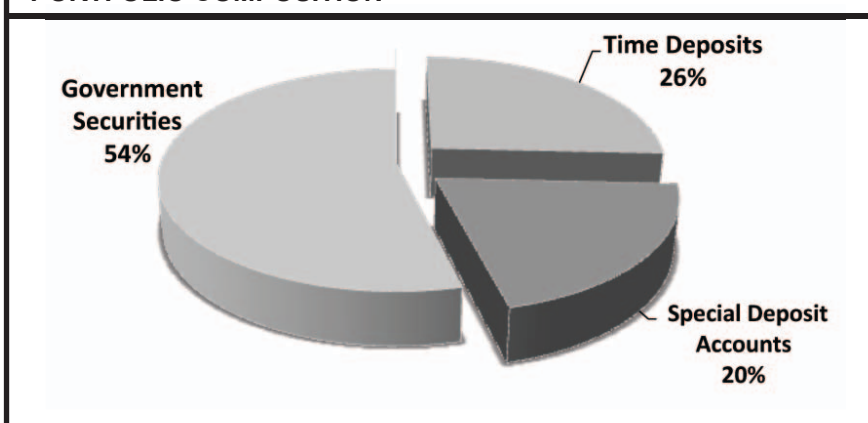
\*\* Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

**RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper and with UCPB Savings Bank, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, amounting to P8.0mn and P4.98mn, respectively, which were approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

**OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY**

The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas kept its policy rate, bank reserve requirement and SDA rate unchanged for the sixth straight meeting at 4%, 20% and 2.50% respectively.

Inflation for the month of May slowed down to 1.6% from 2.2% in April driven by lower food, electricity and oil-related items.

Remittances from OFW grew by 4% year-on-year in April 2015 to USD 2.2 billion. Although it slowed down from the 11.3% growth in March 2015, it still expanding at a healthy pace and is within the BSP's official forecast of 5% for 2015.

Local bonds moved sideways with some selling at the longer end of the curve, perhaps for liquidity requirements. Interest was mainly on the shorter end on the back of the on-going Greek drama and imminent hike in U.S. interest rates.

We have positioned our portfolio in the short end of the curve – with duration of only 1.1 years -- as a defensive measure in anticipation of the upward move in interest rates.
