INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

UBF seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation and income by investing in a mix of equities and fixed income securities. It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the composite return of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index and the Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index AI. 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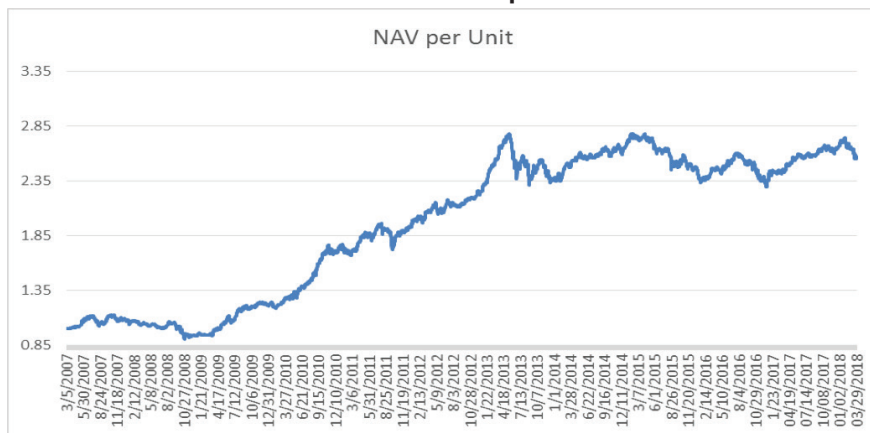

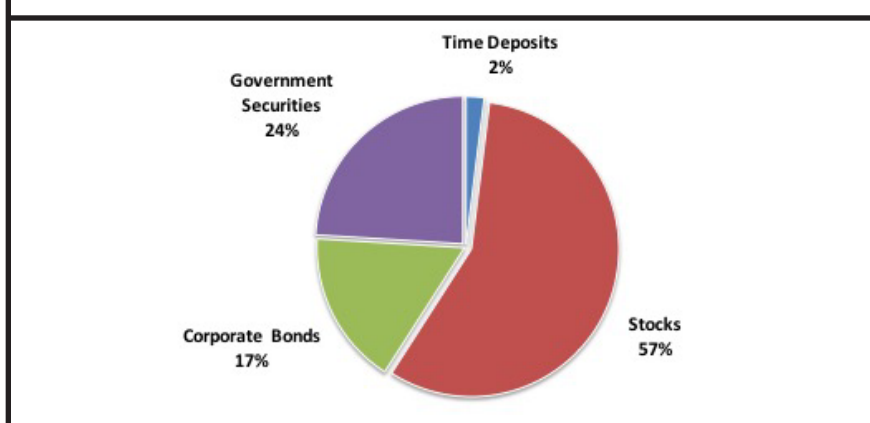
NAVPU Graph

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to P43k, which were approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The market continued to correct as investors shook-off unreasonable expectations that pushed valuations to unsustainable levels. The PSEi fell by almost 6% month-on-month to 7,980. We expect the market to remain weak as it faces strong headwinds. Several capital raising exercises, mainly stock rights offering and a follow-on placement of a major conglomerate will likely siphon market liquidity. The continued weakness of the peso has also discouraged foreign funds from holding Philippine equities. Overseas the brewing trade war amongst major economies and tensions in North Asia have kept investors cautious. However, investors should closely watch the market as value is starting to emerge in some stocks.

As expected the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) has kept its key rates unchanged despite rising inflationary pressures as it views the current situation as transitory in nature. Inflation, according the BSP, will ease back to its forecast range of between 2% - 4% as we move toward 2019. Indicators however point to a March inflation of higher than 4%.

Despite the dovish stance of the BSP, deposit rates and bond yields have risen since the start of the year. Cost of funds have steadily risen since last year. While bond investors have been sidelined, depositors have generally benefited from this development.

Recently however, bond yields have fallen especially along the belly and long-end of the curve. It appears that the bond market has taken its cue from the BSP's firm conviction to keep its rates steady. However, we view this event as temporary as we believe that the BSP will eventually have to raise rates in the near term.

Given this scenario, we remain defensive and has kept our bond portfolio duration lower than the benchmark.
