#### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

UBF seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation and income by investing in a mix of equities and fixed income securities. It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the composite return of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index and the Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index 1-5 Years. This should not be construed, however, as a guarantee of yield.

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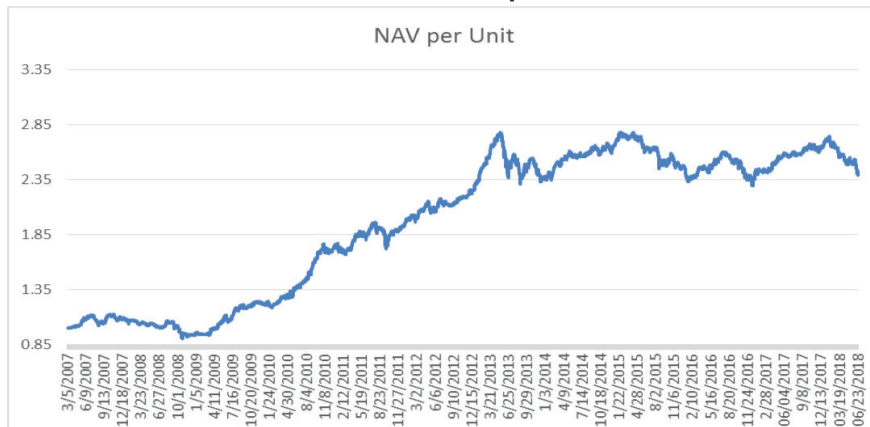

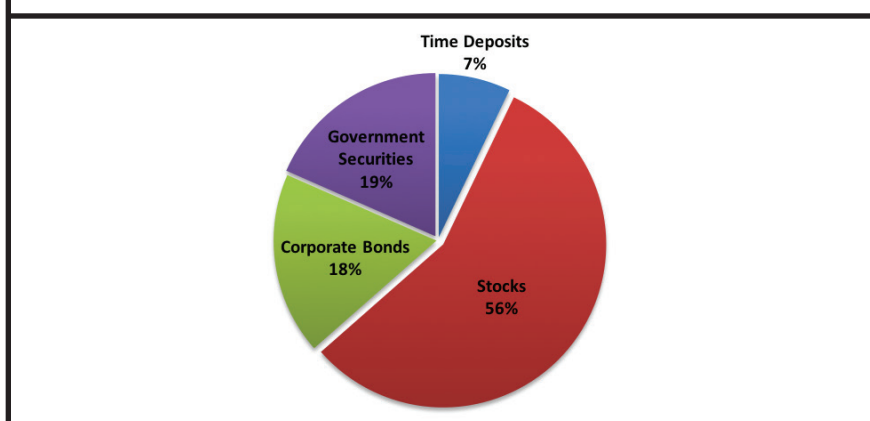
\*\* Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

### RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to P53k, which were approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

### OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

June was another difficult month for equities as the market shed another 4% to end the month at 7,194. Foreign portfolio funds remained net sellers unloading USD253 million worth of stocks during the period, the 5th straight month of net outflows. June was also the month when the 7,500 support level, which held for two months, was breached. The breakdown was swift pushing the index below 7,000 temporarily. On a year-to-date basis, a total of USD1.2 billion have already left the local bourse, slightly more than what entered the market in 2017.

Even while stocks have reached oversold position, investors remained reluctant to increase their position. Concern over the peso weakness will likely keep foreign investors away from our market for a while. In the meantime, uncertainties over inflation, interest rates, and the peso will keep investors cautious and defensive.

The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) hike its benchmark rates by another 25 basis points, bringing its overnight borrowing rate (RRP) to 3.5%. The June hike was the 2nd time that the BSP raised its rates to address upward price pressures. May inflation rose to 4.6% from 4.5% in April. It was the 3rd month that inflation rose above the BSP target range of between 2% - 4%.

Bond yields were marginally higher in June compared to a month ago. Yields will continue to climb on higher inflation expectation. We anticipate inflation to rise further on higher oil prices as well as from the second round effects from wage, fare and tuition fee hikes.

Given this view, we have kept our portfolio duration exposure short. We shall maintain our defensive position until we are convinced that the current tightening cycle has already peaked.
