INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

UPBF aims to provide its participants an alternative long-term investment outlet through investments in high quality and credit worthy instruments such as Government Securities and Deposits, Negotiable Certificate of Deposits, and Non-Negotiable Certificate of Deposits with the UCPB and other banks. It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond 1-5 Yrs. This should not be construed, however, as a guarantee of yield.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

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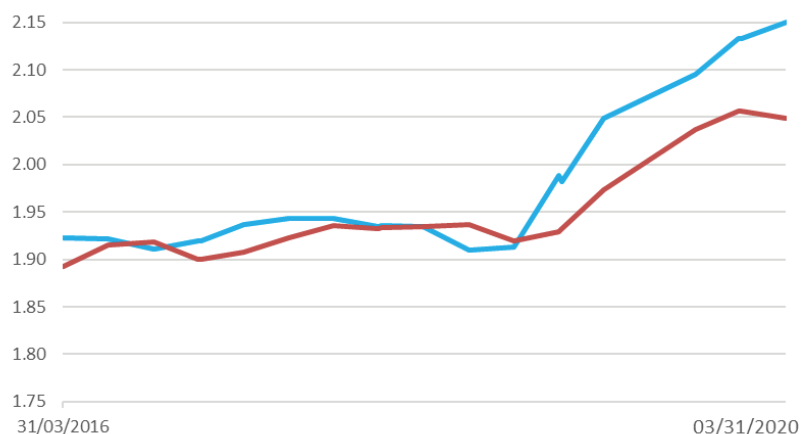

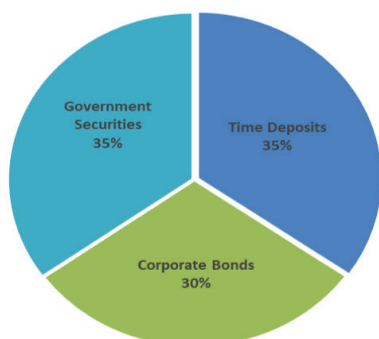
** Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to Php4K, which were approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

COVID-19 dominated the global news for the entire month prompting Pres. Duterte to join other countries in implementing a complete lockdown for most of the country. Towards the end of the month, the BSP responded by reducing its policy rates by 50 basis points and the banking industry's reserve requirement by 200 basis points to help the government in mitigating the negative impact of the pandemic.

Year to date, the yield across the curve went up by an average of 48 basis point led by the 3-year, 4-year and 5-year government securities on the back of uncertainty on the effects of the pandemic resulting in sluggish trading activity and thin liquidity.

In the coming months, inflation is still expected to be manageable with lower oil prices and with no incentive to move higher due to the slowdown in economic activity brought by the Luzon-wide lockdown. We expect yields to trend sideways with a downward bias given the BSP's security buyback initiative and a more accommodating monetary policy. However, there is a likelihood of an upward pressure of yields in the second half of the year once the government starts to borrow more to finance its increasing expenditure.
