It also aims to surpass its benchmark which is the composite return of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index and the Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index 1-5 Years. 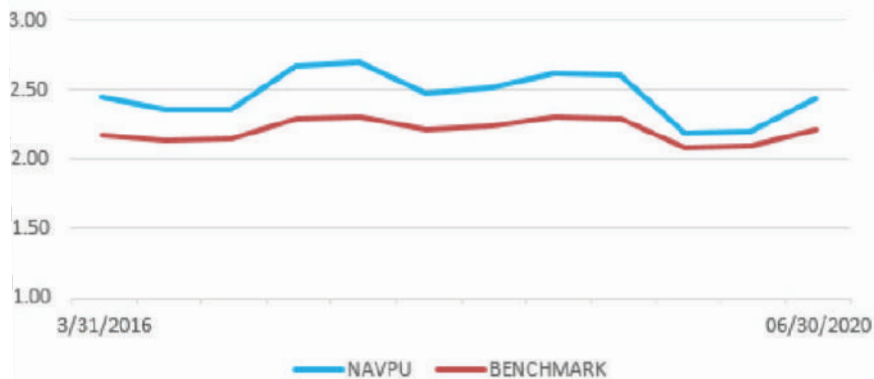

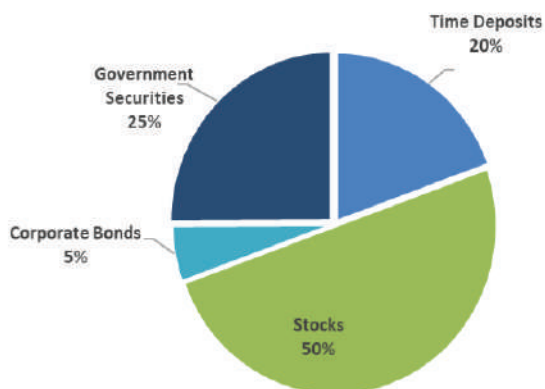

**RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Fund has deposits with the Bank Proper amounting to Php3.8M, which were approved by the Board of Directors. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

**OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY**

Recovery was the theme for the second quarter as both fiscal and monetary tools were in full blast. The Philippine government took advantage the liquidity and borrowed from public that pushed its total debt to Php8.90 trillion, an increase of 15.6% from year-end 2019 level. On the other hand, BSP further eased the overnight reverse repurchase from 3.25% to 2.25% at the end of the second quarter to ensure liquidity and affordable credit facility for the affected businesses, individuals and households.

As a result, Philippine BVAL rates drastically went down by an average of 200 points, quarter on quarter (QoQ). The decline was led by the short-end that went down by 228 bps, QoQ. The belly decreased by 209 points and the long-end went down by 157points at end of the second quarter. Inflation expectation remains benign on lesser demand and slower economic activities as major cities remain under quarantine measures. Short-term volatility on yields may persist due to profit-taking and risk-taking activity of investors as the economy slowly opening-up.

The PSEi extended its rally in June, up 6.3% MoM, as it joined a global rally on hopes of an economic recovery. It has rebounded 34% from its low in March, and foreign investors were back to pouring money as expectations of a recovery are anticipated since lockdowns in NCR and neighboring areas have eased starting June 1. The further strengthening of the Philippine Peso vs the US Dollar provided an added boost to foreign investor's returns.

June welcomed a slew of dismal economic data releases. Foremost among them are April unemployment rate of 18%, May PMI of 40.1, March OFW remittances of -4.7%, and April exports of -51%. The market will brace for a looming technical recession (two consecutive months of economic decline) given the aforementioned economic data and probably worse than expected earnings numbers due to a nearly full lockdown of the economy in 2Q 2020.
